Superintendent Corey stated the document has been presented to and approved by both the Brookline and Hollis School Boards. Following this meeting, it will be posted to the SAU website.

The Memorandum of Agreement deals with safety items that have been discussed with the unions. It outlines how the District will address instances such as illness and/or quarantine of students and/or staff, how the District will develop an evaluation system teachers will be subject to whether in-person or remote, and characterizes that anything we can do remotely this year we will try to do, e.g., open houses, parent/teacher conferences. The document represents the SAU and each of the 3 unions as they were negotiated together.

Vice Chairman Solon thanked the Administration, and all involved in putting the document together believing the intent is both good and important. He stated he would be voting in opposition to the motion as he believes there to be specifics particularly regarding the COOP School District's portion, that he does not feel adequately swing in favor of the students that are going to be learning remotely.

He is also concerned that the timeline, the way it played out, was done strategically in a way that put the Board at a disadvantage. It is not something he can support in its current form.

Chairman Deurloo Babcock thanked the Administration and the union for their time and the amount of energy and effort required to put this document together. She spoke of this being a difficult and challenging time and of how hard it must be for our teachers to understand and deal with what they have to in the coming months. She stated her support of the MOU believing ultimately everyone is trying to get to a place where all of our students are receiving the education they need.
